129 RQS Pilot Receives Purple Heart

An Air Guardsman from the 129th Rescue Squadron was awarded a Purple Heart at Moffett Federal Airfield, Aug. 8.

Capt. Benjamin Copley, an HH-60G Pave Hawk co-pilot, received the Badge of Military Merit, also known as the Purple Heart, by Col. Amos Bagdasarian, commander of the 129th Rescue Wing, in a ceremony attended by fellow wingmen from the 129th RQW.

He recently returned home from his first deployment to Afghanistan after being wounded by enemy forces Feb. 4, during the rescue of a civilian interpreter in critical condition after sustaining a gun-shot wound in the shoulder.

"We got a call to go to a location south of base and I didn't think much of it because we were called out to support a British Special Forces team at same location the day before," the Pleasant Hill native said. "Our wingmen went in to pick up the survivor and were instantly under small arms fire from a nearby building, however they successfully completed the rescue."

Capt. Copley was deployed to Camp Bastion, the main British military base in Afghanistan located in the northwest of the Helmand Province, for 55 days.

On his seventh day in country, after running at least five missions a day, the captain thought he had seen it all.

"Teams were running at an extremely high tempo for weeks at a time, usually working twelve hour shifts that turned into fifteen hour days," Capt. Copley said. "We went into the zone, essentially off memory, landed and completed the pick up, then as we were egressing the area, all I remember was --BAM!"

Flying low at about 120 knots, about 150 miles an hour, after leaving a successful rescue, a round went right through the pilots windshield, shattering the night vision goggle mount on his helmet, said the captain.

"I wasn't wearing a face shield, so I got shrapnel in my face and neck," the traditional guardsman said. "There was a lot of blood, so we flew directly to the Bastian hospital and I instantly hoped in an ambulance."

While being taken care of at the hospital, Capt. Copley was informed that the maintenance squadron had already replaced the windshield and the aircraft was mission ready again. However, the captain took a little longer to recover.

"I was given local anesthetic to remove larger pieces of shrapnel in my cheek and lip," said the captain. "After being on the ground for two days, I was cleared to fly again."

For the next week and a half Capt. Copley was called back to the same location.

"The quickest lesson I learned was to always wear my face shield," said the pilot. "I did a lot of soul searching since the incident, and dealt with having to return to it every day, however, now that I'm back at the 129th, I've already volunteered for our next deployment rotation."

'Our Military Kids' Grant Program

Our Military Kids wants to help your family through the deployment of your loved one. If you have a child or children between the ages 3 to 18, and your spouse is currently deployed overseas with the National Guard or Reserves, your child is eligible for a grant. The grants, which can be up to \$500, will pay for up to six months of an extracurricular activity at a location of your choice in your geographic area.

The grant application process is simple. Visit our website at www.ourmilitarykids.org and select the appropriate one-page application (<http://www.ourmilitarykids.org/how-to-apply/apply-now.php>). Once you download and complete one application per child, send it to us via fax or regular mail, along with a copy of three supporting documents:

1. A copy of the Title 10 deployment orders
2. A form of ID for your child – we accept a Military ID, birth certificate (if Service Member is shown as a parent), or 1172 Deers form (printout showing dependents from DEERS website is acceptable)
3. Attach a flyer, brochure, registration form or website printout showing contact information and program costs (be sure to include documentation showing monthly or weekly fees, equipment fees, registration fees, etc.)

Once we receive your application and documents, a check is sent within ten days directly to the service provider of the activity. We will match the cost of six months fees plus registration fees, equipment fees, etc. An exciting notification packet will be sent to each child informing them that the grant was approved.

Keep in mind – we can only provide grants to children with a parent who is currently deployed – if your service member has yet to deploy, you may apply for a grant no earlier than 30 days prior to the report date on the title 10 Mob orders.

The most difficult part of this process is deciding which type of activity you would like your children to participate!

Sittercity.com

Sittercity is the nation's largest online source for local babysitters, nannies, elder care providers, dog walkers, housekeepers and tutors, and contains more than 1 million caregiver profiles. The Sittercity Corporate Program, funded by the Defense Department, offers military families, including active-duty, Guard and Reserve members, with a paid membership to the site.

The paid membership enables military families entry to a custom-built Defense Department Web site portal where they can match up caregivers to their situation; gain instant access to caregiver profiles that include background checks, references and reviews; and find military-certified care providers as well as caregivers who are military-subsidized and authorized access to a military installation.

Tutor.com

The Tutor.com for U.S. Military Families program gives eligible military families access to free online tutoring and free homework help from live, professional tutors in more than 16 subjects. Tutors help K-12 students, college students, and service members and spouses going back to school or through a career transition. K-12 students can get help in more than 16 academic subjects, including algebra, chemistry, calculus, and physics.

Adult learners can get back-to-school and career help, including GED prep and resume writing. Eligible members and the tutor work together in a secure online classroom, where they can chat, draw on a shared whiteboard, upload files, and browse the web together.

Air Force Officials Increase Deployment Times

The air and space expeditionary force rotational baseline will be changed from 120 to 179 days for most active component Airmen. Expeditionary combat support Airmen will begin their transition to the new baseline in December 2010 with full implementation expected by October 2012. According to Air Force officials, 71 percent of Airmen are already deploying outside the 120-day baseline. The revised construct will therefore increase predictability for affected Airmen and their families while providing better support to combatant commanders by increasing continuity at deployed locations.
