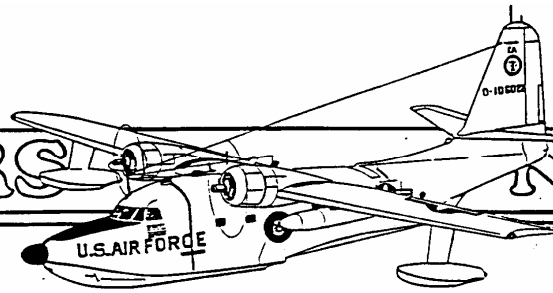

Space-A Travel Update

Recently, Air Force officials announced a very positive change in the Air Force Space-A lodging policy. Now, base lodging managers may accept and confirm reservations for priority 2 (space available guests) up to 30 days in advance of the arrival day, for up to three nights accommodations. Also local managers have many options to accommodate space-A guests and will not bump priority 2 customers with confirmed reservations for priority 1 customers. This new directive replaces the long-standing policy of only accepting space-A reservations 24 hours in advance and requiring guest to show up at the base lodging office at 6:00 p.m. on the desired day and hope that the accommodations were available.

Another interesting travel note is the Military Living's United States Military Road Atlas. If you are planning a driving trip or plan to visit another state in our good old US of A, you will find this atlas has a wealth of information. You can order the atlas by calling 1-800-527-2345 and give the operation catalog item code K741N, or log on to www.militaryliving.com or check the Travis AFB exchange.

We have been able to book reservations at McCord AFB and at Fairchild AFB near Spokane, Washington 30 days in advance. We are looking forward to using the base facilities and traveling on less per day the military way!

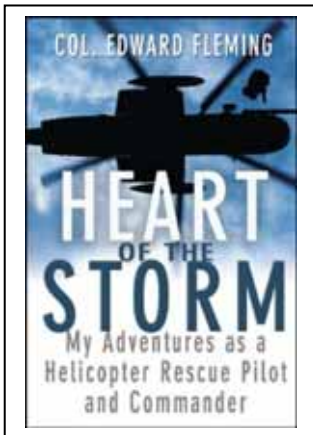

Heart of the Storm : My Adventures as a Helicopter Rescue Pilot and Commander

From the "perfect storm" to the South Pole, a stirring true-life adventure story by a celebrated helicopter rescue pilot - During the course of a 30-year career in helicopter rescue, Colonel Edward Fleming led scores of high-risk, high-profile missions, including rescue operations during the Halloween storm of 1991 described in Sebastian Junger's *The Perfect Storm* and the successful rescue of Dr. Jerri Nielsen from Antarctica after she developed breast cancer. Now, Colonel Fleming takes readers along for a bracing ride as he recounts the most thrilling episodes of his long career. With all the nail-biting excitement of a bestselling thriller, *Heart of the Storm* brings to life dramatic jungle rescues in the Philippines, the longest helicopter rescue mission in history to save crew members of a Ukrainian freighter 840 miles off of the coast of Nova Scotia, a nearly disastrous rescue off a listing two-masted schooner during an Atlantic winter storm, and many more—including the ill-fated "perfect storm" operation of 1991 and the exceptionally difficult Dr. Nielsen rescue. Fleming describes the many near-misses and narrow escapes he and his crews experienced, as well as many tragic losses he witnessed. Through it all, the courage and professionalism of Fleming and his crews aboard their "Jolly Green Giant" HH3E and MH60 helicopters shines through, making this suspenseful, richly textured book an exhilarating read for anyone who enjoys true-life adventure stories.

Col. Edward Fleming, retired (Eagle Bridge, NY), served in the Air Force and Air Force National Guard for 30 years as a helicopter rescue pilot and was the Commander of the 106th Operations Group, 4412th Squadron, in the Persian Gulf and the Vice Commander of the 109th Airlift Wing. Over the course of his career, he was responsible for saving 293 lives.

Editorial Review

From Publishers Weekly

During his 30 years in the Air Force and Air National Guard, Fleming made a career of descending from the sky to pluck disaster victims from the jaws of floods, storms, sharks and polar white-outs. His gripping memoir vividly illustrates how tenuous the life of a *deus ex machina* can be. Fleming recalls the tragic and sometimes gruesome deaths of unlucky colleagues who succumbed to the elements and recounts hair-raising missions that often took place at night, flown through hazardous weather (including the vicious nor'easter Sebastian Junger made famous in *The Perfect Storm*) in fragile helicopters prone to mechanical breakdown. Avoiding gung-ho special-ops bluster, he probes the human flaws and lapses—incompetent, panicky pilots, abusive officers, penny-pinching bureaucrats who refuse to pay for much-needed equipment—that bedevil even elite outposts of the military. Fleming's sober, straightforward, well-paced style lucidly conveys the lore of helicopter flight and the practical difficulties of rescue missions while letting the heroics speak for themselves. 18 August 1924 – 10 August 2004

Born in Agenda, Kansas, Ed passed away at his home in Fremont, California, just a week shy of his 80th birthday. The family moved to Fremont in 1938, and he has been a resident of Alameda County since that time.

He joined the U.S. Navy in 1943 and proudly served aboard the battleship USS. Pennsylvania and, later, the oil tanker USS Kankakee. He was honorably discharged in late 1946. From 1958 through 1978, Ed was a member of the California Air National Guard in Hayward, where he served as an aircraft maintenance mechanic.

Ed was predeceased by his father, Edwin E. McNemar; his mother, Havana McNemar; and his sister, Arlene McNemar Cranor. He is survived by his sister Iris Atkinson of Central Point, Oregon, and several nieces and nephews.

Services were held August 19 in Fremont.
